The Village of Rushsylvania Council met in an Open, Publicly Advertised Meeting on Monday, July 10, 2023 at 7:00 P.M. Council Members present included Acting Mayor, Jason Miller, Sarah Eagy, Tim Rader, Trish Wilson, Jeremy Lowe, and Chris Crumley. Mayor, Phillip Wright, was absent. Solicitor, Zeb Wagner, Village Employee, Chris Coak, and Fiscal Officer, Kathy Stierhoff were also present. Visitors present: Troy Gibson, Rachel Stahler, Scott Stanfield, Victoria Zupan, Tom Zupan, David Roberts, Vicky Erdy, Jenni Blair, Jim Akers, Ben Kave, Nancy Kave, Morgan Mitchell, Josh Adams, Alexander Brogan, Adrianna Brogan, Deanna Fry and Erica Caudill.

Acting Mayor, Jason Miller, called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance and Roll Call were given.

BUSINESS

CHRIS COAK REPORT

Water/Wastewater Superintendent, Chris Coak submitted a list of projects completed and work to be done. Gallons pumped 1,077,000, Gallons billed 789,100 at 73%. The meter at 113 N Miami Street was rewired. All hydrants were flushed and tested with no issues found. The extra aerator was picked up from West Liberty. The wiring for the venting system in the screen room and the diesel fuel pump at the Waste Water Treatment Plant were wired. New concrete was laid around the clear well at the Water Plant by Bobcat Multiworks to meet OEPA compliance. 1.5 tons of sludge were hauled to Cherokee Run Landfill. The sludge drying bed was refilled. The computer timer on the screen auger failed. It is to be repaired on Wednesday. A new chopper pump was installed at the Waste Water Treatment plant RAS pit. The consumer confidence reports were posted downtown and on the village website to meet OEPA compliance.

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The annual calibration was performed on the flow meters at the Waste Water Treatment Plant to meet OEPA compliance. The stop sign and post were replaced in the alley at 154 N Stewart Street. The shelter house door was repaired. The pothole on South Sandusky was patched. Banners and flags were hung downtown for the Independence Day Celebration. The streets were swept for the Independence Day parade. Damaged plywood was replaced and repainted in the shelter house. Graffiti was removed and the wall repainted on the west side of the shelter house. A downed tree was cut up and removed on county road 113. Scrap metal will be taken to Sims for recycling. The Chlorine tank will be replaced at the Water Plant. Preventive maintenance will be performed at the Waste Water Treatment Plant. Watts has been called for pricing for a regulating valve at the Water Plant. No reply has been received as yet.

KATHY STIERHOFF, FISCAL OFFICER

Mrs. Stierhoff reported that she has been contacted by the Auditor of State's office that the next audit will be performed by an independently contracted financial firm. Several firms have been contacted to bid on the contract. Mrs. Stierhoff will be out of town on August 7-9.

PHILLIP WRIGHT, MAYOR

Acting Mayor, Jason Miller, shared notes sent from Mayor, Phillip Wright, as he is on vacation. Mayor Wright reported that graffiti was found on the side of the shelter house. The Logan County Sheriff has been notified and the graffiti has been cleaned by village employees. Cardboard was stuffed into outlets in the shelter house. Mayor Wright removed the cardboard. He also is requesting Council consider cameras in the park. The Independence Day celebration was a success in spite of threatening rain. He hopes Council will consider supporting the celebration next year. During the parade, Sheriff Dodds complimented the appearance of the village and the lack of issues his office has had in the village. Residents have reported issues with catch basins on Susie Street and the corner of Rush Street and Miami Street. Chris Coak was contacted about these issues. There are several properties that are becoming a nuisance with overgrown weeds. He asked about the status of these properties. He asked if the Street Committee could do a study of the possibility of digital speed limit signs in the village citing S Sandusky Street, Miami Road, County Road 50/Railroad Street, and Rush Street/County Road 113 as particular concerns. He asked if the Parks Committee could look into a possible digital sign in the downtown park to advertise events in the village. He has had no correspondence from LUC concerning the Planning Commission meetings. Mayor Wright is running for reelection this fall. If elected, it will be his final term.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Street Committee --

Parks Committee -- Tim Rader stated that the committee met with Miracle Company and will send quotes for what he thinks the park needs based on committee ideas. The slide can be fixed with epoxy filler. There need to be more playground equipment for small children. He suggested pieces that could replace the spring animal pieces. He will quote a handicap swing for the swing set. Anything that is ordered will not be available until next year. Mr. Rader said that the committee would like to put into place a five year plan for upgrading the playground. Chris Coak stated that some of the equipment could be installed by the village. Sarah Eagy suggested that if a handicap swing is installed there needs to be some work on the surface area to allow wheelchairs to get to the swing. The company also has shaded benches for parents to use when watching kids play.

Code Enforcement Committee --

Records Committee -- Jeremy Lowe stated there is a link on the website for the consumer confidence report.

Ordinance Committee -- Sarah Eagy stated that there are multiple ordinances that are coming up for vote at this meeting.

Finance Committee -- Jason Miller reported that he has been working on completing the employee handbook. He has received the lease agreement from Stanfield Technologies. It is the Finance Committee's recommendation to open the lease agreement up to any internet providers that want to bid. Zeb Wagner advised that the bid would need to be advertised in the paper including the date to submit sealed bids. They would need to be opened and reviewed at a Council meeting then referred to committee. Mr. Miller stated that it is the goal to provide what is best for residents. Scott Stanfield commented that it may not be legal to provide power to a private company in a lease situation. Troy Gibson stated he would provide more information by the next meeting. Mr. Miller stated he has been trying to understand the technical parts of the agreements as he realizes how important internet access is to rural areas.

RESIDENT COMMENTS

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Jenni Blair, 7520 CR 5 N, Rushsylvania, OH was in attendance representing the Rushsylvania Beautification Association. She inquired as to the possibility of creating a garden exchange behind the shelter house. People would leave plants and gardening supplies they no longer use, and take items other residents leave. The RBA would clear out the area and maintain it. They would also provide a sign so users can locate it. They hope to create a community garden later. The association has cleaned up the park downtown and power washed the old station on the park side. They would like to paint a mural on the side of the building and paint the cannon. Other ideas they are working on are a digital sign in the downtown park informing residents and people passing through the community of upcoming events. They are working on pricing signs and hope to partner with the village on the purchase. The RBA car show is on August 26. They are requesting that the streets and sidewalks be cleaned as well as down in the gutters. Chris Crumley asked if an ordinance could be passed next month giving them permission for the garden exchange. Jason Miller asked if the Parks Committee might be willing to work with the RBA on the projects. Sarah Eagy stated the Ordinance Committee could work on putting together an ordinance.

Troy Gibson, 5911 SR 47E, Bellefontaine, OH, was offered the floor, but said his questions were covered during the Finance Committee report.

David Roberts, 215 S Sandusky Street, Rushsylvania, OH, had concerns about the electric rates. He stated the township signed a deal and he understood the village was a part of it as village residents voted on the measure. However he has been told the village is not a part of the aggregate and feels they should be. Chris Crumley stated the village did vote on the measure and it sounds like they should be included. Josh Adams of Aspen Energy stated that it was the intent to include the village. They met with a Council representative to inform them of the aggregate forming but no resolution was passed by the village. The electricity suppliers were not comfortable providing electricity to village residents through the aggregate due to possible legal issues in the absence of a resolution. They are now asking to have a ballot issue presented to the village so residents can be included. The intent is to create a contract with the village that ends on the same date that the township contract ends and then to merge the two hoping to bring rates down further. If the issue passes at the ballot, they can have the aggregate set up within weeks – definitely by December. They will facilitate education meetings concerning what the aggregate will mean. David Roberts responded that the board of elections informed him that as the aggregate was on the village ballot, the village would be included. Zeb Wagner informed that the village is a separate entity and therefore passes its own legislation. Mr. Roberts stated that he voted for the aggregation so he should get the rate. Mr. Adams stated that the village was not meant to be left out by Aspen Energy. The suppliers were not willing to recognize the village as a member.

Ben Kave, 152 Railroad Street, Rushsylvania, OH, asked about the status of the Noise Ordinance. Jason Miller stated it was ready and would be voted on during this meeting. He would like to see speed limit signs and cameras. Jeremy Lowe stated that to be enforced people would need to be caught in the act. Mr. Kave asked if the village has ever had a police department. Zeb Wagner stated that there had been a policeman years ago, but it is very expensive. Additional patrol hours could be contracted with the Sheriff's Department if they have the manpower available. Mr. Kave asked if video evidence from his home cameras would be admissible as evidence. Mr. Wagner stated it would not. Morgan Mitchell, 116 Walnut Street, Rushsylvania, OH, asked to speak and stated that her neighbor stopped a policeman in town and reported the excessive noise in their neighborhood. The neighbor was told that since Rushsylvania does not have a Noise Ordinance, they can do nothing. She feels that there is no harm in having an ordinance in place for these issues. Jason Miller stated that the Finance Committee could look into the cost of extra patrol hours from the Sheriff's Department. Sarah Eagy stated that she felt it would be within Mayor, Phillip Wright's, authority to work out an agreement with the Sheriff's Department.

Vicky Erdy, 137 Rush Street, Rushsylvania, OH, stated that she had been told the village was closing the alley beside her property and wanted to know why. Fiscal Officer, Kathy Stierhoff, informed that Zoning Officer, Keith Levan, had inquired about how to close this alley due to contention between the neighbors. However, alley closures must be requested by a resident whose property adjoins to the alley and approved by all property owners adjoining the alley. She stated that she has no interest in having the alley closed. She just didn't want the neighbor's dog defecating in her yard.

Jim Akers, 137 N Stewart Street, Rushsylvania, OH, stated that his neighbors at 141 N Stewart Street had geese causing a stench and flies in the neighborhood. There are five coops in the back and coops along the side of the house. A privacy fence was erected by the neighbor and he believes no permit was acquired. Jason Miller stated that the Zoning Officer would need to get involved to check the status of the issue. Mr. Akers also stated that he is getting run off from the village park which floods his yard. Chris Coak stated that maybe the issue will be fixed when the RBA cleans up the area for the garden exchange.

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Ben Kave asked if the lane his neighbors across the street are using the run vehicles back to village property behind their property was an alley that could be closed. Tim Rader stated that it is a right of way to the village property. Zeb Wagner stated that there would need to be a check of the property with the Logan County Recorder to see the actual status of that area. Sarah Eagy stated that residents can call Mayor, Phillip Wright, to get the Zoning Officer or call the Health Department with issues with neighbors.

Erica Caudill, 201 N Sandusky Street, Rushsylvania, OH, stated that the neighborhood with noise issues was not the only one in the village. Neighbors south of her often run their derby cars up and down their driveway creating a lot of noise.

OLD BUSINESS

The internet tower, employee handbook, and electricity aggregation have already been addressed.

Solicitor, Zeb Wagner, was asked to address the Ordinance publication requirement. He stated that ordinances are not required to be published before passage, but need to be published after passage. He stated that several ordinances that have already been passed need to be published. The Ordinance Committee will look through the Ordinance list provided by the fiscal officer to prioritize the ordinances to be published.

NEW BUSINESS

Fiscal Officer, Kathy Stierhoff, informed the board that she attended the Logan County Emergency Management Agency's meeting. Helen Norris, Director of the Logan County EMA worked with her to update the village's portion of the plan and fill out a survey of village needs. Council members were provided with copies of the plan and the survey. The Logan Countywide plan will be sent to the Federal Emergency Management Agency later in July and once approved, the village will be asked to pass a resolution adopting the plan. The village was encouraged to join the National Flood Insurance Program even though the village is not in the flood plain. This gives residents the ability to purchase flood insurance if they so choose.

Chris Coak reported on the repaving project using the Ohio Public Works Commission grant monies. Work has not begun on these projects. The meeting at the Logan County Engineers to begin the process is set for July 20. He is hoping to get more information after that meeting takes place.

Chris Coak also reported that he has information about speed indicator signs that are solar or battery powered. They are fairly expensive so the village may begin with one and see if it is an effective deterrent.

Acting Mayor, Jason Miller, stated that he would like to see cameras put up in the park and possibly around other village owned properties. He proposed that Council request that Mayor, Phillip Wright, look into the cameras and get prices. Chris Coak stated that he would be able to mount the cameras but was not knowledgeable about the technical part of the installation. Sarah Eagy asked about surveillance warning signs. Jason Miller asked Solicitor, Zeb Wagner, if that were required and Mr. Wagner stated that it isn't a requirement.

Discussion was held concerning Section 6 of the ordinance. Jeremy Lowe questioned that as the ordinance is currently written, fireworks can only be exempted if put on by the village. Solicitor, Zeb Wagner, stated that Ohio Revised Code makes it legal for residents to set off fireworks on certain days of the year. Jeremy Lowe asked if the ordinance could reference the Ohio Revised Code since the current proposed ordinance could cause citizens to be cited.


